## FEDERAL LAW GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO:

- · Form, join, or assist a union;
- · Choose a representative to bargain with us on your behalf;
- Act together with other employees for your benefit and protection;
- · Choose not to engage in any of these protected activities.

WE WILL NOT fail to timely inform you, upon your request, of the specific window period to effectuate your dues cheek-off authorization revocation.

WE WILL NOT fail to notify you that you can revoke your dues check-off authorization at the expiration of the collective bargaining agreement.

WE WILL NOT maintain a dues check-off authorization agreement that does not allow for you to revoke your dues-checkoff authorization at the collective bargaining agreement's expiration.

WE WILL NOT in any like or related manner restrain or coerce you in the in the exercise of your rights under Section 7 of the Act.

WE WILL inform you, upon your request, of the specific window period to effectuate your dues check-off authorization revocation and WE WILL include a notice in our response that says that you may revoke your dues-checkoff authorization at the collective bargaining agreement's expiration.
